Lent is a time for more intense, personal prayer - a reckoning with the individual soul. Through private prayer we show God that we are serious about becoming a better person.

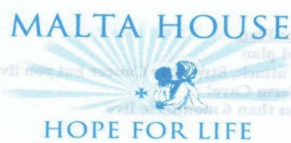
