Below is an explanation from Erin Neil, L.C.S.W., Director of Safe Environment & Victim Assistance Coordinator.

Each lesson helps kids to recognize a safe and trusted adult and be able to spot the tricks used by adults who we may at first think are safe people but may turn out not to be. It is so important for us to be part of that message of safety in this challenging world we live in."
